HISTORY

Peacock Military Academy was founded in 1884 by Professor Wesley Peacock, Sr. It has been one of the oldest private schools in the Southwest operated under the same family management. It has been a college preparatory, military oriented type of school since 1899. In 1904 it was the first school in Texas or any Gulf State to be recognized by the U.S. Government with a Class "A" rating. Throughout the year it has maintained an Honor School rating. Its academic department has also been accredited for many years by the Texas Education Agency, as well as being a member of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools.

It was chartered in 1933 as a non-stock, non-profit institution, governed by a Board of Directors. Since 1926, Professor Peacock Sr.'s two sons and two daughters became active in the management of the school, Col. Wesley Peacock, Jr., Col. Donald W. Peacock, Miss Dorothy Peacock, and Mrs. Sarah T. Hames. Under their direction and after 47 years it was found necessary to close the Academy. No heirs or other successors were to be had to carry on the life of the institution and to sustain its traditions.

A small building on the campus has been retained as a Records Office. Alumni and friends may continue to make contact with the officials at this location. The Salvation Army took occupancy of the school plant on June 15, 1973. They will maintain an enlarged headquarters thereon for their many charitable, humanitarian and social services for the community and area.

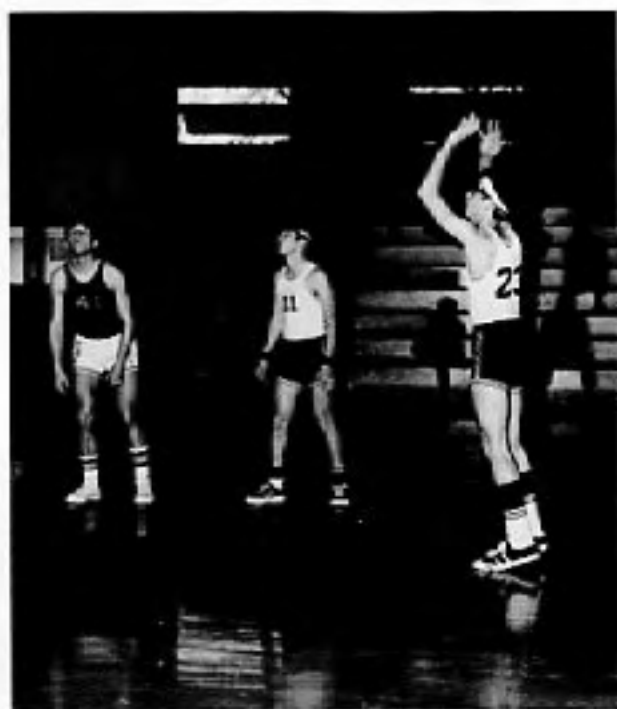

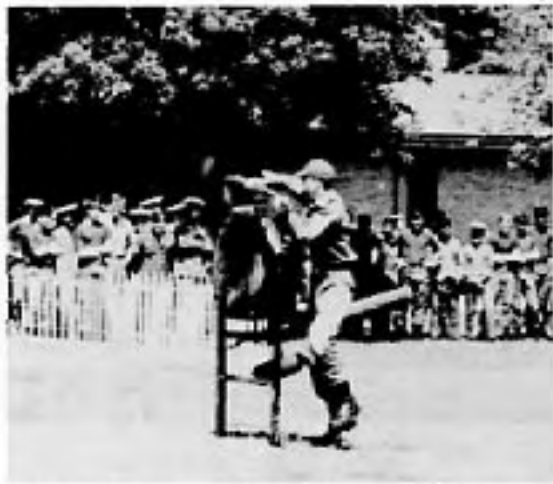
