Call to Order

Meeting called to order by Frank Torres, President.

Roll call

A quorum was present – the meeting proceeded.

Reading of the Minutes

The minutes of the previous board meeting were read by William Whitfield, Secretary. The board approved the minutes.

Treasurer's Report

The treasurer's report was given by Ed Ford, Treasurer. Ed discussed the balance sheet and said he had filed the IRS report of the association's status electronically. Rudy Johnson moved to accept the report as given; Bill Morse seconded; the motion carried.

PAR Report

PAR held its annual meeting in early March at the Wesley Peacock House. Mike reported that the \$30,000 CD was earning 5.18 % interest and the checking account of \$17,760 was getting 1.6% interest. Expenditures were made for an hp laptop computer and hp scanner/printer for converting the records to disk. Besides keeping the original files, 2 copies of disks will be made, one kept in a fire resistant safe. There was also an expenditure of \$2,151 for repairs to the Wesley Peacock House. Mike also said that the VHS tapes had been converted to DVD. At this time, Mike mentioned that the Peacock Fountain was to be placed on the Senior Terrace in time for the October Reunion.

Kadet Medals

Rudy Johnson said we were continuing to present medals to the schools and additionally a K-Bar knife to the Marine Academy. Earl Adams was given the medal for presentation to the Marine Academy.

Other Old Business

Mike Vlieger received a letter of resignation from Jerry Houston. Mike also reported we were nearly out of *PARADE REST*, *Book Two*.

Reunion 2008

Reunion 2008 will be held at the Gunter Hotel, San Antonio, Texas. Mike Vlieger brought up using Gerald Ragsdale, Class of 1971, with his karaoke equipment. It was recommended to use him Friday night on the roof garden of the St. Anthony, and try to get the Sentimental Journey Orchestra for Saturday night at the Gunter. It was moved, seconded and the motion carried to leave the budget and choice up to Mike Vlieger.

Russ Doty moved to adjourn; Butch Daughtry seconded the motion – the motion carried. The meeting adjourned at 2:37 PM.

COLONEL DON'S LAST ARTICLE FOR THE PMA NEWSLETTER

PARADE FOR MAMIE

She didn't rate Secret Service Agents, but, if she ever needed protection, Ike had plenty of help available: he had just been double-promoted from Colonel to Major General and placed in command of all American forces in Europe.

Later, as the U.S. participation in World Ward II intensified, Ike was again double-promoted – this time to Five-Star General, Supreme Commander of all Allied Forces.

On April 18, 1944, Mamie was visiting her sister who lived in San Antonio. While in town, Mrs. Eisenhower accepted an invitation to be the honored guest at "Mamie Eisenhower Day at Peacock Military Academy."

Mrs. Eisenhower received a tour of the campus and ate with the boys in the Mess Hall. She spent the greater part of the day reminiscing with the Peacock family about her courtship days – when she watched the 1915 football team practice and cheered the boys on at games. Most especially, she remembered watching the young football coach: U.S. Army Lt. Dwight D. Eisenhower. "My Ike," she called him.

World War II was in full force in April of 1944. On other fields, in other parts of the world, battles raged while preparation was underway for the upcoming Allied invasion of Normandy in June. On the fields of Peacock, however, it was a peaceful spring day when PMA cadets -- in full dress uniform -- proudly honored Mamie and the school's longtime association with the Eisenhowers with a special parade.

It wouldn't be many years more before Mamie did rate her Secret Service Agents -- when she became First Lady of the United States.

Bell (nee Edwards) was the honored guest – he was in the final 12 selected for the initial astronaut program – 7 were taken. He was a test pilot, graduate of the Naval Academy. He served as an "Upper Classman" for a year at the opening of the USAF Academy to guide the freshman cadets. Was "Mr. Everything" at PMA. Six-year cadet. Killed in Viet Nam in 1965. Buried beside his father, Marine Sgt. Robert Bell (killed in Indo China in 1932!) at the Cisco Cemetery.

ANOTHER ARTICLE OF INTEREST

This movie brought tears to my eyes. It was released in 1941 and in 1942 won the Academy Award for Best Picture. Greer Garson won Best Actress and Dame Mae Widden won Best Supporting Actress. It is the story of a suburban upper class English family during the start of WW II and the Nazi blitz.

My Mother's birthday was December 6th and on December 7, 1941, my brother, Lee, and I took her to lunch and to see that movie at the Wichita Theater in Wichita Falls.

It was a wonderful movie and as we walked to the car, we talked about how terrible it was to be at war. The newsboys from the Times were hawking an EXTRA. We purchased one – it was that the Japanese had attacked Pearl Harbor and the USA was at war! A week later it was Nazi Germany. We were in WW II!

My brother, Lee Slaughter, Class of 1944, later joined the Navy and was on the Aircraft Carrier Saratoga during the 1945 Battle for Okinawa, the southernmost island of the Japanese Empire. He was on a 5" sponson gun mount and was at battle station for almost 3 months as the Jap Kamikaze planes tried to sink our ships. We lost over 80 ships. He was a hero - not wounded but was emotionally scarred by the battle. I was young but did my part - trained as a "Minute Man" to deliver messages in the event of an invasion and joined the Texas State Guard the National Guard had been mobilized early in 1941. Also, I helped in War Bond drives and greeted the movie stars who came through town on bond drives.

Long story and I told most to the movie and popcorn group after dinner. They all enjoyed the story and applauded.
