# LEST WE FORGET



Peacock Military Academy is located at Woodlawn Lake, some three miles northwest of the center of San Antonio. It was founded in 1894 (56 years ago) by Professor Wesley Peacock, and is considered one of the oldest private schools in Texas under the same family management. Nine boarding students filled the first school building, a converted homestead.

A state charter was issued the school on February 18, 1904, and in the same year it became one of the first three schools in Texas to be recognized by the U. S. Government. A U. S. Army officer was then detailed to the Academy to serve as professor of military science and tactics.

On July 7, 1908, we were classed "A" by the War Department. Ours was the first school, not only in Texas but in any Gulf state, to receive this recognition. A consistently high rating has been achieved each year. With a change in the system of grading schools of our type in recent years we have managed to improve this high rating. The term before the last all previous efforts were climaxed by our receiving the highest possible grade of Superior.

During World War I the Academy was designated to train young men to become officers in the Army. After the War the Veterans Bureau leased the school plant, where subsequently over five thousand ex-servicemen were given vocational training under Government supervision.

Upon termination of the Government lease in 1926, Professor Peacock gave the active management of the school to his two sons, Colonel Wesley Peacock, Jr. and Colonel Donald Peacock. In realization of the wishes of the founder, the Academy, in 1935, was rechartered as a non-stock, non-profit educational institution.

During World War II the Academy again served the nation and our state by training its cadets to take their places in the total war effort which led to Victory.

Of course, through the years Peacock has grown in physical stature from its humble beginning of one frame building on a single lot to a community of fifteen structures on a twenty-acre campus. In educational stature we are justly proud of our long and successful record of fifty-six years experience in training young men for college, for business, and for life.
