This is a story, our story of the year 1950-1951 at our school, Peacock. This story actually started way back in 1894 when Professor Wesley Peacock founded P.M.A.

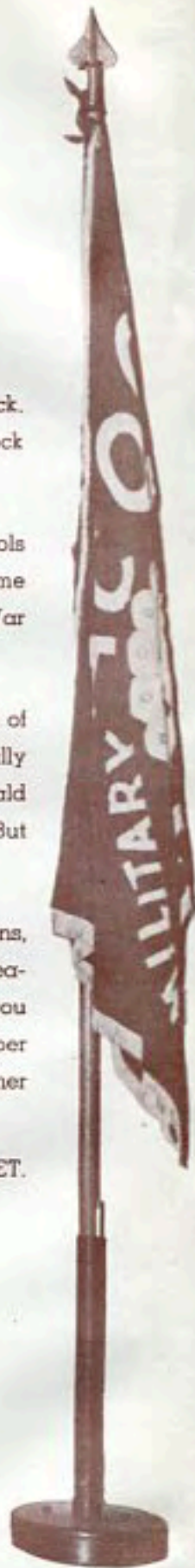

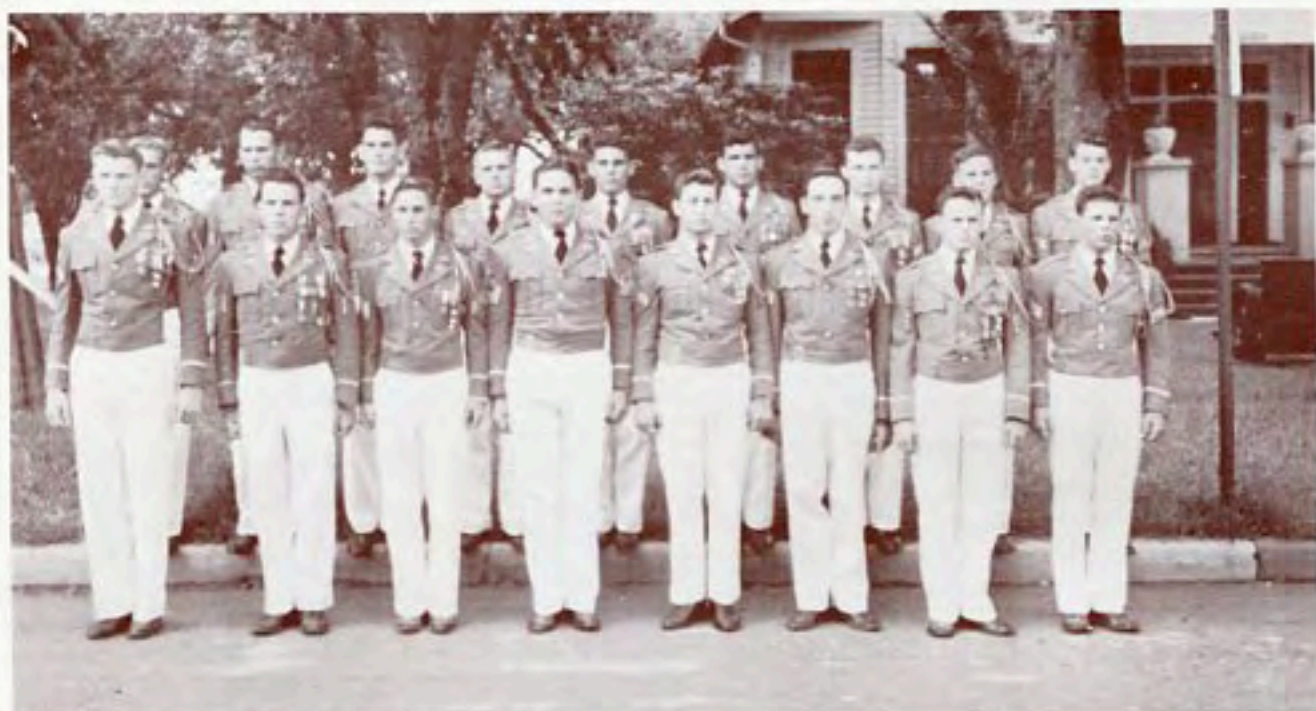

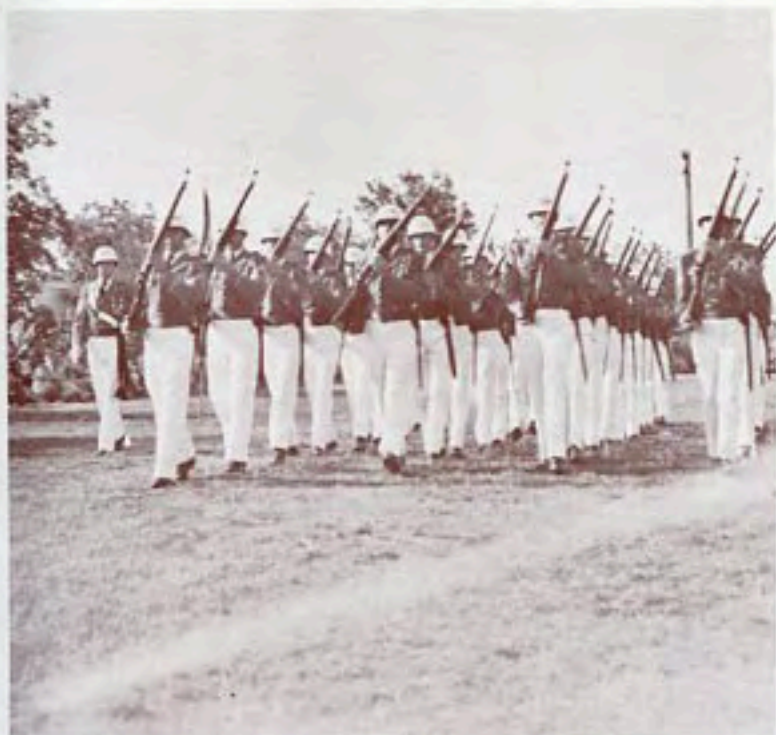

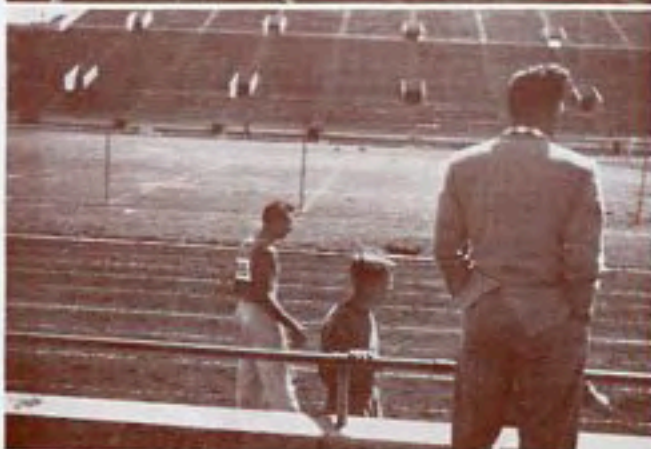
