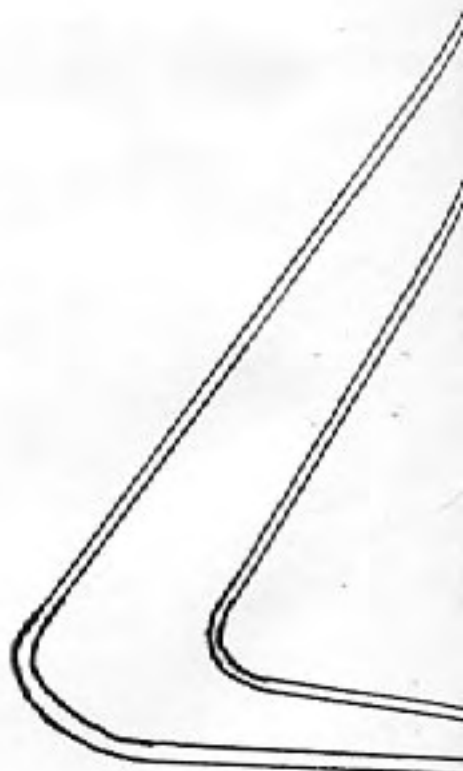


## GREETINGS AND BEST WISHES!
