THE CAMPUS HAS CHANGED

If you have not returned to the old campus since the Academy closed in June of 1973 you will certainly be surprised at all the changes that have taken place at "Peacock Center", as it is now called by The Salvation Army.

The Parade Ground is now the site of a three million dollar apartment complex for senior citizens. Johnston and McKinnon Halls have been razed and replaced with two modern brick dormitories for the "Peacock Village Home for Girls", which also utilizes Adams Hall and Richardson Hall.

\$500,000.00 was spent to update and brick veneer the Gymnasium, with an addition thereto for a large games room. This building plus the two athletic fields are dsignated the "Peacock Community Center". The Auditorium building has been updated and brick veneered, and renamed "Evangeline Center". A \$350,000.00 building directly across the street from the Wesley Peacock House is called "The Peacock Citadel", and contains a beautiful chapel wherein religious services are held. It adjoins the old dining hall which is now called "Fellowship Hall".

Birkhead Hall and Phelps Hall remain unchanged, and are used primarily for storage. The Log Cabin is used for meetings of various youth activities similar to Boy and Girl Scouts.

The McGimsey Library, the last building constructed by the Academy, is now the headquarters and administration building for all Salvation Army activities in San Antonio.

PATE CHALLENGE UPDATE

In our last NEWSLETTER we announced the challenge to the Alumni Association wherein A. M. "Aggie" Pate, Jr., Class of 1938, and Sebert Pate, Class of 1945, stated that for each \$1.00 the Alumni donated to the Peacock Academy Records Trust Fund they would donate 50¢, to a total amount of \$5,000.00. For example, they would donate \$1,000.00 for each \$2,000.00 donated by the Alumni Association and its members.

We are pleased to announce that we have already donated \$2,200.00 to this Fund, which has been matched by \$1,100.00 by Aggie and Sebert Pate.

The Peacock Academy Records Trust Fund was started by the Peacock Family to help maintain the memorabilia, archives, and permanent records of the 15,000 plus cadets who attended the Peacock Military Academy.

Only the interest earned on the principal is used for this purpose. The Records Office, as well as the Alumni Office, is located in the "Wesley Peacock House" (formerly the Academy Headquarters) which has been designated as a historic landmark by the Texas Historical Commission.

A. M. "Aggie" Pate, Jr., Class of 1938, and Sebert L. Pate, Class of 1945, are Chairman and Vice Chairman respectively, of the Texas Refinery Corporation with headquarters in Fort Worth and branch officers in Mexico, Canada, and Luxembourg, and with warehouses in principal areas worldwide.

LOYALTY RECOGNIZED

During the years prior to the closing of the Academy, A. M. Pate, Jr., Class of 1938, and Sebert Pate, Class of 1945, were generous donors and supporters of the Peacock Military Academy, donating several thousand dollars to the purchase of books for the Library, for a hardwood floor for the gymnasium, and many other contributions for various activities. And now they have made the Alumni Association a \$5,000.00 challenge toward support for the Peacock Academy Records Trust Fund established by the Peacock Family.

In recognition of their outstanding loyalty and support of the Academy and the Alumni Association, "Aggie" and Sebert have been elected Life Members of the Association and Honorary Life Members of the Board of Directors of the Association.
