It seems that I just did write a message for the Newsletter, but alas it is time to draft another. Mike Vlieger called and reminded me that duty was calling.



EXTRACT FROM 1904 PMS CATALOG

The school provides an iron bedstead, a mattress, a locker, a gas-light, a table and chairs for each room. Each cadet furnishes a rug, a clothes bag, a double blanket, a comforter, four sheets, a pillow, four pillow cases, six towels, night shirts, and such articles as soap, toothbrush, shoe polish, comb and hairbrush. Standing collars only that meet in front are used.
