Friday Afternoon October 5: We will open the Don Yust Hospitality Suite (Executive Salon 5) at 3:00 p.m. for greetings, reunion registration confirmations, identification tags, etc.

Friday Evening October 5: Kadets and guests will gather in the San Antonio Ballroom. Social hour (cash bar) will be from 6:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. At 7:00 p.m. we will have a seated buffet dinner. We will have a brief program after dinner. Later, the Hospitality Suite will re-open.

Kadet News

Conrad Banspach Jr. '37 originally from San Antonio, is well and still active in his family engineering firm in St. Petersburg, Florida. He has not lost his sense of humor. When we called and told him we were from the Peacock Military Academy, he immediately said "What tha hell did I do now? Conrad distinguished himself during WWII in flight combat and instruction. He trained on radar both crews that dropped bombs on Japan in 1945.

Jim Carey '51 lives in Donna, TX (moved from Port Isabel). He graduated from Texas A&M in 1956 and later completed a Master's Degree at Texas Tech Air Force ROTC. He has great stories about Peacock, including the one about a brawl in a hamburger joint in New Braunfels after a football camp. It started when an employee of the establishment stated that "they did not serve Mexicans". Some of the members of the Peacock team did include Latin-Americans, including my Costa Rican father Arthur Wolf '51.

Alvin Burden M.D. '51 from San Antonio sent a message

stating: "Peacock had a profound impact on my life, for which I'll always be forever grateful. My wife and I celebrated our 61st wedding anniversary this year. I have been retired since 1998. We took our three daughters to watch the dress parades from 1966 to 1973. Although I was a day student the five years I was at Peacock, the bond has remained for life".

Jerry Houston '52 lives in Fort Worth, Texas. He was Battalion Commander, Valedictorian, and captain of the football team. He later played under Bear Bryant at Texas A&M where he graduated. He had a distinguished Navy career first as a fighter pilot accumulating 6000 hours, commanding two fighter squadrons and later commanding a ship. He served several tours in Vietnam. He also served in Naples, London, and as U.S. Naval Attaché to the American Embassy in Buenos Aires, Argentina before retiring.

Johnny Gabriel '54 heads Gabriel Industries in San Antonio, TX. He has excelled in his civic work for the community. He was crowned Rey Feo in 1991 for the 100th Celebration of Fiesta San
