The McKinnon Rifles

One of Peacock Military
Academy's revered
traditions was the
performance at parades
of the special unit called
The McKinnon Rifles.
This great drill team easily
won every competition
they entered. The unit
was named for John
McKinnon, Professor
Wesley Peacock's greatgrandfather who was an
early settler of southern
Georgia.

The McKinnon Rifles were formed during the 1947-1948 school year. They were a new attraction

for the Spring Parade of 1948. They were organized and supervised by Major Dick Thiesen, later Col. Thiesen, who had arrived at Peacock as a professor of English and Military Science in 1946. Col. Thiesen came to Peacock right after WWII. He had landed in Normandy on D-Day with the 23rd Infantry about 3:00 pm dodging sniper fire as they disembarked the landing barges. He no doubt was the ideal organizer for a special drill unit that became a great and illustrious Peacock tradition.

The first Peacock cadet commander of the McKinnon Rifles was Cadet Capt. Charles Ritchie '48. The last cadet commander of the unit was Cadet Lt. Lee Robert Montague '73. There were many other outstanding cadets between those years who lead the distinguished disciplined platoon.

One of the McKinnon Rifles greatest honors was to be selected as the Honor Guard that welcomed Dwight Eisenhower at the San Antonio Airport for his visit during the fall of 1952. Cadet Capt. Richard E. Bradford '53 from Houston, TX was the unit commander. President Eisenhower did not simply wave or nod when approaching the McKinnon Rifle Honor Guard; he asked Cadet Bradford if he "could review the troops". Mr. Eisenhower took his time reviewing and noted that Bradford and the other boys "were much larger than those he coached back in 1915 at Peacock. That team was undefeated.

Richard Bradford later played football at Texas A&M, and professional baseball. He became a famous Hollywood actor in dozens of movies along with famous actors. Some were: The Chase, along with Marlon Brando, Missing with Jack Lemmon, Little Nikita with Sidney Poitier, Trip to Bountiful with Geraldine Page, The Hoodlum with Andy Garcia, and The Milagro Bean Field directed by Robert Redford.

One of The McKinnon Rifles emblematic drill move was the King James Salute; the performance of its technique was perfected in 1959 under unit commander Robert D. Scoggins '59.

President Dwight Eisenhower returned to visit San Antonio and Peacock in 1961, and James Robert Hyslop '62 commanded the Honor Guard unit that welcomed him.

For a while, a Junior McKinnon Rifles unit was formed. Cadet Officer Michael Vlieger '62 had the honor of supervising and training the group.

The highest ranking cadet military leader in 67/68 was 1st Capt. Joe Patrick Early '68 from Avinger, Texas. His Adjutant was Roger Henson '68. Following a tradition of military excellence, the Peacock Military Academy cadets swept the General Maddox invitational for the 3rd year in a row. This time, the school sent a different group for the Drill Team Competition. Instead of the Zouaves who had taken top honors for the previous 2 years. A special group of McKinnon Rifles members represented Peacock and also won.

The McKinnon Rifles, they still march and drill in our hearts. Many have left us and no doubt they are entertaining crowds in that parade field beyond. President Eisenhower, Col. Wesley, Col. Don and Col. Thiesen are watching and enjoying their heavenly performance.
