Dear Mr. and Mrs. Murley:

It is most regrettable that we must advise you of Joe's having left the campus the other night after Taps, in company with another cadet, slipping out without permission, going to the city, and returning to the Academy about 2 o'clock in the morning. Special Order No. 25 is enclosed, as well as confirmation by Joe of this infraction of our rules.

After a private talk with Joe, and an effort on our part to impress upon him the seriousness of this offense, we believe he now understands that, should he be so foolish as to be guilty of similar misconduct the remainder of this session, he will be subject to suspension from the Academy without recourse.

This is more or less of a common violation of the rules of many boarding schools, but I know you will agree with us that it should not be condoned. We feel that our boys are permitted sufficient recreation and visitation to the city at proper times, when eligible, without their being of a mind to slip off during the night, when they are much more apt to fall into serious difficulties.

We assure you that our best efforts will be exerted to have Joe overcome this infraction by showing the proper attitude and a renewed determination to make a successful record here at Peacock.
